

But in recent decades it has become clear that fossil fuels release noxious pollutants into the atmosphere and increase the amount of carbon dioxide. The *scientific* consensus is that the burning of fossil fuels over the last 100 years has caused the climate to change.

We now know that dirty electricity generation is no longer viable due to its polluting properties, but fortunately, solutions are abundant. Clean energy technologies are accessible through new products and services becoming effective replacements for fossil fuel technology and traditional electricity generation.

What is renewable energy, and what are its benefits over fossil-fuel based sources? Time for an explainer!

What Does Renewable Energy Look Like Today?

Renewable generation that taps into clean energy sources like the sun, wind, and water has been extensively developed over the last 50 years. These renewable technologies are now mature, cost effective, and being installed at a rapid rate—and don't require any digging, pumping or fracking, unlike fossil fuels. Generating electricity from renewable sources results in improved air quality that corresponds to lower rates of health problems and premature deaths. As more clean renewable infrastructure is built onto the electrical grid, the burning of polluting fossil fuels becomes less necessary to meet demand. Solar and wind energy are often referred to as "clean energy" because they generate no carbon emissions when they're turned into electricity.



How Wind and Solar Are Empowering More Communities and Transforming the Grid

Photovoltaic (PV) solar technology harnesses the power of the sun. While the sun's energy has been used for centuries to heat homes via direct sunlight, today's PV semiconductors convert photons from the sun's rays into power to make a more efficient electrical output. With no emissions, no noise, and no water wasted to operate, PV solar can be installed anywhere the sun shines. It's no wonder an assortment of solar options are multiplying rapidly, from grid-tied energy consumers becoming producers with rooftop installations to consumers having access to local solar production through community solar farms, and more. Thanks to decades of investment put into research and development, solar is a growing part of our energy mix and a realistic alternative to fossil fuel generation.

Wind turbines are being installed around the world at a faster rate than ever before, both onshore and offshore. The largest wind farms are installed miles out into the ocean where they tap into the strongest winds, and then generate megawatts of power for cities globally. Today's wind turbine tech has evolved from simply grinding grain to powering homes. Wherever the wind blows, turbines can be installed to harness the kinetic energy, spin a generator, and create power. One of the most exciting hotspots for wind development is in the heart of oil country in the central United States, in states like Texas and Oklahoma.


Why is Renewable Electricity Generation Important?

These new renewable energy sources have allowed millions of individuals and communities to choose clean, renewable energy, and rely less on dirty fuels.

Generating electricity from clean sources means that communities benefit in both direct and indirect ways. Communities benefit because there is less pollution coming from nearby coal and gas power plants, which means cleaner air and water. Indirectly, it means that the community is no longer putting pressure on the global ecosystem and contributing to climate change.

Purchasing clean energy also sends a clear, powerful message to the local utility and government decision makers that when given the option, customers choose clean energy over antiquated, unsustainable fossil fuel technologies.

These benefits, combined with the growing efficiencies in manufacturing renewable technologies, are the reasons that clean energy generation is growing so quickly. In fact, 51% of the new electricity generating capacity added in the United States last year was in renewables. To realize the full potential of renewables, the electrical grid must be able to store power so it can be used when it is needed. For example, electricity generated from the sun or wind can be stored in batteries to capture excess energy for later use.




Even with the rapid growth of clean energy, many people still experience barriers to take advantage of it. For example, some homes are lacking sufficient roof space, or don't have enough sun or wind to generate their own clean power on-site. Renters are also in a difficult situation, because adding on-site renewable production has to be initiated by the owner; and in multi-family housing any large project like solar or wind would require approval from the local homeowners' association.

But now, homeowners, renters, and multi-family housing tenants in many states have the option to purchase renewable energy from providers who specialize in supplying renewable electricity to their customers. This means that consumers who buy renewable energy from electricity suppliers are supporting the continued development of solar and wind power instead of dirty fossil fuels.

Over the last few decades, an increasing number of electricity markets have been deregulated, meaning many utility customers are no longer locked in to buying electricity from their utility.
